TITLE: CHANGE IN CORE REQUIREMENTS FOR MA PROGRAM

SUMMARY:

The Department of Communication Studies proposes to remove COMM 6103 (Communication Ethics) from the list of required courses for the MA curriculum.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO CATALOG COPY

Degree Requirements

The Master of Arts degree program requires the completion of thirty (30) credit hours of graduate work. All students, regardless or orientation and area of study, must complete five (5) four (4) core courses. All Students writing a thesis or a directed project earn their final six (6) credit hours with research based activities.

Core Courses

COMM 6011 Topics in Communication Research Methods COMM 6100 Communication Research Methods COMM 6101 Contemporary Viewpoints in Communication Theory COMM 6102 Professional Seminar in Communication Studies COMM 6103 Communication Ethics

JUSTIFICATION

This change puts us closer in line with core requirements for other MA programs in Communication Studies at other North Carolina state universities, all of whom have fewer required core courses than we. It gives our graduate students greater flexibility to craft a plan of study that more closely meets their needs. In addition, it is a better use of faculty resources. Instead of addressing the content area of ethics in one specific course, faculty will address communication ethics as part of the Professional Seminar course (COMM 6102) and as part of individual courses, giving the advantage of teaching students how to better apply ethics throughout their study and career.

There are no prerequisites for this course.

IMPACT

This course will affect all graduate students, beginning with the class entering Fall 2011. It will affect graduate elective courses, as students will enroll in an elective course within the department instead of this required course. Enrollment in COMM 6103 has averaged 11 students over the past three years. This course is offered in spring of each year, and students who would have taken this course will instead take one of two elective courses. Historically, our elective courses in spring semester have averaged 4 students. These courses have the capacity for the additional number of students that will result from this change.
