SON 04-19-12 Revisions of NURS 6115: Health Policy and Planning in the U.S. Summary

The School of Nursing proposes to revise the objectives of NURS 6115.

- a) Recent changes in how CCNE (the professional accrediting agency for nursing) defines essential educational content for MS in nursing requires updating of the course description and objectives to meet accreditation expectations. The proposed changes bring the course in line with the new guidelines.
- b) There are no changes in pre/co requisites for this course
- c) Course numbering remains the same.
- d) This proposal improves the focus of the course and meets accreditation expectations.
