## Memorandum

RE: Recommendation to Award Degree in Memoriam

In accordance with faculty policy, undergraduate students in good standing at the University at the time of their death and who do not meet the requirements necessary to be awarded a posthumous degree may be recommended by the faculty of the College to receive a degree in memoriam. Travis C. Christian, died in Virginia on March 1, 2020. Travis was last enrolled at UNC Charlotte in 2012. He had 120 earned credit hours. Although ineligible for a posthumous degree due to his standing in his major program, Travis was in good standing with the University and is therefore eligible for a degree in memoriam.

On Friday, October 9, 2020, the faculty of the Belk College of Business voted to recommend awarding a degree in memoriam to Travis C. Christian.

Therefore, I request that Travis C. Christian be awarded a Bachelor of Science in Memoriam.
