Faculty President Avrin announced a slight agenda reorder. The Report of the Chancellor will move up from agenda item #6 to agenda item #1.

- 1. **Report of the Chancellor.** Chancellor Dubois gave the following report:
  - Let's talk enrollment and the consequences for our budget. The shooting has impacted our enrollment numbers. Enrollment in the Graduate School has been well and has offset some of the loss. There has also been a decline in transfer students from community colleges likely do to the economy. We will not be at our high of enrollment in Fall 2018. Budget funding is based on actual enrollment. We will not have a budget reduction this year, as it is based on enrollment from 2018. We will have a reduction in tuition collection. I have asked for a three-year window to get our enrollment back to our norm.
  - When we built the current Belk Plaza, we only built half of the plaza. It may be about \$2 million to finish Belk Plaza. A design jury and advisory committee will send call to architecture teams for memorial. There are faculty, staff, deans, and students on that advisory committee.
  - There will be an on campus memorial at 2:00 P.M. on April 30<sup>th</sup>. At 5:40 P.M. there will be a bell ringing.
- 2. **Minutes of the Previous Meeting of the Faculty Council.** No discussion ensued. Ford-Eickhoff moved to approve the minutes. Allan seconded the motion. <u>The minutes for the January 9, 2020 meeting were approved unanimously.</u>
- 3. **Request to Award Degree in Memoriam to Aleksi Kinnunen.** Allan moved to approve the request. Dixon seconded the motion. The request to award a degree in memoriam to Aleksi Kinnunen was approved unanimously.
- 4. **Request to Award Degree in Memoriam to Parth Patel.** Ford-Eickhoff moved to approve the request. The motion was seconded. <u>The request to award a degree in memoriam to Parth Patel</u> was approved unanimously.
- 5. **Proposed Changes to Procedures for Resolving Faculty Grievances.** Avrin indicated that Faculty Ombuds Todd Steck was present to answer any questions. No questions were raised. Hague moved to approve the requested changes. Allan seconded the motion. The motion to approve the requested revisions to the Procedures for Resolving Faculty Grievances and advance to the Board of Trustees was approved unanimously.
- 6. **Proposed Changes to Faculty Council Consent Calendar.** Whitaker moved to approve. Hague seconded the motion. The motion to approve the requested revisions to the Standing Rules of the Faculty Council were approved unanimously.

- 7. **Report of the Provost.** Provost Lorden provided the following report:
  - The Belk College of Business did an excellent job with the Barnhardt Seminar on Ethics and the World of Business.
  - Pulitzer Prize-winning science writer and journalist Elizabeth Kolbert is coming on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Earth Day. She will be a terrific speaker for the TIAA Lecture.
  - I sent a thank you note to the Faculty. We had 90% participation with early alerts. Hopefully we will also get on-time submission of grades too.
  - B.S. in Data Science, M.S. in Computer Engineering are working their way through the
    process. Being reviewed by the UNC System and might be approved by the end of the
    academic year. I'm hopeful.
  - The decline in transfer students is fairly significant. We need to continue to look at how to make transition into our programs by transfer students as smooth as possible.
  - Next week is the student success summit. In trying to get students into a major, we need to
    find any barriers to entry. We need to study and find best methods to get students into and
    then through their areas of study. We have made a lot of progress, and need to find ways to
    keep that movement going.
  - We hired Aimee Hawkins, our Director of Communications, about a year ago. She has given thought to how to get the word out on the good work faculty are doing. We will be putting together a podcast. We will produce better stories about the work of our faculty. Trying to translate some of what we do for the public. To build an academic reputation, we need to let students and the public know what we are doing.
- 8. **Report of the President.** Faculty President Joel Avrin said he agreed with the Provost that it is important we disseminate to the public the many great contributions our faculty have made to the region.
