SUBJECT: Request to Posthumously Award an Undergraduate Degree to Mariyah Hargrove

One of our undergraduate students, Ms. Mariyah Hargrove, passed away on December 24, 2012. She was a senior, Management major in the Belk College of Business. Mariyah was also completing a Minor in Operations & Supply Chain Management and the Undergraduate Certificate in Business Entrepreneurship. I am requesting that the Belk College faculty recommend awarding her a posthumous degree.

The University policy states that “any student who at the time of his death was duly enrolled and had completed 90 semester hours towards a degree at UNC Charlotte shall, upon the recommendation of the faculty in his College, be awarded his degree posthumously.” (*April 17, 1975*)
