Demonstration and Resource Team (DART)

- +50 various University personnel trained in mediation for campus demonstrations/First Amendment assemblies
- 6 events have occurred
- Create non-hostile environment





Diversity Dialogue Workshops

- Known as Conversations That Matter
- Workshops are monthly during the academic year
- Welcomes all University faculty, staff and students
- Hosted by the Multicultural Resource Center located in Popp Martin Student Union



Suicide Prevention and Coping Skills

- Sponsored by the Counseling Center
- 3-4 successful suicides per year at the University and many more suicide ideations
- Individual, group sessions and workshops are available
- Interactive training available for faculty, staff and students



Risk Management for Greek Life

- Developed risk management program
- Added another position to manage it
- 5 % of student population are part of the Greek Life



SAFE Student Advising for Freshmen Excellence

- Academically moderate to high risk
- Provide year of mentoring with staff and student peers
- Fall 2016 GPA 3.2 average of SAFE vs GPA 3.0 of incoming freshmen





Retention Efforts

Retention and graduation rates have increased and our division has contributed by:

- Promoting 1st year students living on campus versus living off campus
- Involving new students and transfers in academic and social activities (Get Connected Survey)
- Expanding SOAR (Student Orientation and Registration) for the students who were admitted late

Levine Hall

Health and Wellness Center (HAWC)
